
OPPORTUNITY KNOCKS:

Last year I purchased a Kolrosing knife and a DVD on Kolrosing by Judy Ritger. I finally got around to watching the DVD and attempting a simple Kolrosing project. The DVD and the knife were purchased from Pinewood Forge at www.pinewoodforge.com . The DVD was very easy to follow and gives a good deal of instruction as well as history of Kolrosing. Judy even touches on Rosemaling (a style of painting that uses the same pattern form as Kolrosing. The kit includes patterns ranging from simple to intermediate and advanced. The pattern I chose for my first project was from a combination of two sources. The border was from the patterns supplied in the kit. The Iris pattern used was from a Lora Irish pattern included in her "Great Book of TATTOO Designs". If you are interested in checking out this book by Lora Irish, it is in the Club Library. It includes a wide range of patterns suitable for Kolrosing as well as Woodburning.
