## **SCRIBBLES**:

I have changed up the Scribbles starting this month. Since this year's show is in October it opens the door to the option of having carvings that are based on fall, Halloween, and Thanksgiving as well as our traditional Christmas related show carvings. In order to get some ideas flowing I am including some fall related carvings this month.

This first carving I call "Pine Nut". Like my typical Scribbles it is done on a 1.5" X 1.5" X 3" piece of basswood. Start carving a pinecone as done in the article in Woodcarving Illustrated "Hand Carved Holiday Gifts Vol.2" but leave one corner square. Carve a face on this corner to give the pine cone character. See pictures at the right.

Please feel free to carve this scribble and let me know if you have a scribble you would like to share or if you have an idea you would like to see as a scribble.

## **SCRIBBLES 2**:

A lot of folks have published articles about carving wood spirit faces on leaves. You do not need a pattern for this type of carving. Just walk outside and pull a leaf off a tree. Place the leaf on a piece of basswood, draw around it then cut out the leaf silhouette. Next draw a face of your choice on the silhouette and start carving.

The one here I call "Two Lips". I pulled a leaf off of a tulip tree in my back yard and sketched a face that felt right.



The following are ready to carve and are based on Maple and Sycamore leaves.





Try some of your own and most importantly have fun..

Let the chips fall where they will. We will find a broom and dust pan somewhere.
