## OPPORTUNITY KNOCKS:

Just a quick reminder to those that were at the last Club meeting and an update for those what missed the meeting. Jessica of fostercareintheus.org gave a presentation about their organization and asked if the Club would be willing to carve a trophy for an upcoming event they are planning. The club discussed the request and decided to take the project on. The following is a list of the specifications for the trophy as I remember them.

- The trophy is to be presented to a winning school at the end of a yearly competition.
- The trophy is to be carved out of wood and left unpainted.
- It is to be approximately 12 inches by 12 inches by about 16 inches tall.
- It is to include space along the base for brass plates containing the names of each year's winning school.
- It is to include a carved house representing needed permanent supportive housing for homeless and foster kids.
- It is to be topped off with a tin cup. The cup represents the Cup of Christ whose protection and guidance is paramount in each home.
- The trophy is to be completed by late October.
- We agreed to have possible designs ready for our August 3:30 pm meeting. The club will review/discuss those designs and choose one to collectively work on over the following months. The trophy would be completed/displayed at our Show in October.
- Design possibilities that have been brought forth so far include: - A two story house. - A log cabin. - A house that looks like the house the organization is currently working to renovate. - A whimsical house. - A house made from a Cypris knee.

Strive to carve on something every day. I hope you will continue to support the Tri-State Woodcarvers Club as part of your personal woodcarving journey. As stated in the Club bylaws "The objective of this Club shall be to promote the art of woodcarving, and to provide activities for woodcarvers."
