Ken Alvey is still hosting power carving on Wednesday evenings. If you are interested in trying power carving, contact Ken about time and space availability.


### **ORNAMENTS:**

Remembering Bob Koressel, Club Historian, Club Memorial Plaque custodian, Carver and Friend.



Robert L. "Bob" Koressel, 91, of Evansville, passed away on Tuesday, August 22, 2023 with his loving family by his side.

Bob was born August 6, 1932 in Evansville to the late Raymond and Julie (Hartman) Koressel. Bob was a 1950 graduate of Memorial High School, where he played football. He was an active, devoted member of St. Boniface Catholic Church and in 2002 was inducted in the Brute` Society of the Diocese of Evansville for his service to the church. He was widely known as the St. Boniface historian and lead tours of the St. Boniface Grotto for many years. Bob worked as an industrial engineer for thirty years at Bucyrus Erie and later at

the City of Evansville Water Department for ten years before retiring. Bob was a professional wood carver and a member of the Tri-State Woodcarvers. He created thousands of hand-crafted carved pieces and ornaments, many of which were given to friends and family members. Bob was a founding member of Twin Towers and a 4th degree Knight in the Knights of Columbus. He also served his country as a veteran of the United States Army on the Alpine Survival Team in Europe. He participated in the Honor Flight in 2017. While in the Army he also played football and boxed on the Army boxing team. Bob loved his family dearly and enjoyed attending his grandchildren's and great grandchildren's sporting events.

Surviving Bob are his wife, Carolyn (Siemers) Koressel; daughters, Debbie (Ralph) Schickel and Donna (Jeff) Martin; son, Michael (Rendie) Koressel; a sister, Carolyn Wenzel; seven grandchildren, Shane (Shannon) Schickel, Kevin (Sherida) Schickel, Melanie (Bob) Johnson, Brian Koressel, Scott (Ashli) Koressel, Natalie (Cody) Lee and Lauren Martin; fifteen great grandchildren and one great great grandchild.
